Williston Oak Project



The Alliance will be working with the Williston Alumni Association, Matt Sullivan's AIG students at Williston Middle School, and Penderlea Farms to harvest acorns from the magnificent oaks in front of the historic Williston High School buildings. Penderlea Farms will raise these legacy saplings and the Alliance will give them away to the public in a year or two.

Advocacy Committee update

Our Advocacy Committee meets monthly to evaluate projects and issues. If you are interested in learning more about this work, please contact Laura McCabe at laura@acftrees.org.

On October 3, the New Hanover County Commissioners will hold a joint Public Meeting with the Planning Department, to review public input on their Comprehensive Plan 2050. You can find more information about how to attend this meeting **here**.

Wilmington is updating its Technical Standards Manual to remain current with industry technologies, materials, and practices, while also providing guidance for land development code requirements. Committee members are reviewing drafts of the first four chapters; members of the public are also welcome to do so through October. You can view the standards here.

NC's Big Tree Conference

Our area was well represented at the NC Urban Forest Council Conference, held in Hickory September 25-27, as Hurricane Helene was barrelling north. The Alliance for Cape Fear Trees was recognized several times during the state-wide conference. Our 2023 Tree Stewards Program was the first pilot of this program statewide, in partnership with the Urban Forest Council. The Alliance was also included in the presentation by Andy Pleninger, NC Forest Service, as an example of collaborating organizations.


Sally described Wilmington's tree ordinances, as part of a panel discussion that also included presenters from Charlotte, Raleigh, Cary, Durham and High Point.

September weather was average

According to the National Weather Service, Wilmington received 8.53" of rain last month versus the September average of 8.69". Last year, we only got 3" of rain in September.

The average temperature last month was 75.7 degrees versus the September average of 75.3 degrees. The average high last month of 83.7 degrees was also the average high for Septembers.

So September was average - but it can still be hot. That said, it is always a good idea to keep an eye on your trees this time of year as we transition to fall.
